Calhoun County Museum receives Grant for "Barn Again" Exhibit Fall 2004


Smithsonian Exhibit comes to The Calhoun County Museum & Cultural Center

"Raising the Loft: The South Carolina Barn Story," a project focusing on the heritage of rural South Carolina, and the exhibit "Barn Again! Celebrating an American Icon." The project, a Smithsonian Institution traveling exhibit, examines the barn from the architectural and cultural perspectives. It can be seen at six museums in the Palmetto State in 2004.

"Barn Again! Celebrating an American Icon" is part of Museum on Main Street, a partnership between the Smithsonian Institution, the Federation of State Humanities Councils and individual state humanities councils that serve small-town museums and residents of rural America.

"We're pleased to sponsor this Smithsonian exhibit to six SC museums. Museums in South Carolina's smaller communities play a very important role in preserving the state's history and culture," says Randy Akers, Executive Director for The Humanities Council SC. Barn Again! Is only part of this state-wide project "Raising the Loft: the SC Barn Story". Each of the six communities will develop local exhibits and events to engage the local community, school children, teachers, and visitors. 


