Calhoun County Turns 100 Years Old

In the year 1908, Calhoun County was formed from parts of Lexington and Orangeburg Counties. It had taken the future citizens of Calhoun County seventeen years and two referendum

defeats before they were successful in their efforts. In 2008, our county will be 100 years old, and County

Council has asked the museum to plan a year-long celebration. The museum is working hard to make this happen. "Save the jail" is the rallying cry in Calhoun County, where local efforts are being galvanized to preserve the crumbling Fort Motte Jail, the oldest public building in the county.

"It was built in Orangeburg County in 1907. When we became a county, we inherited it in 1908," said Debbie Roland, director of the Calhoun County Museum and Cultural Center. "The reason for the jail is they were so far away from

Orangeburg, if people were unruly on the train, or if someone was disruptive, they were taken off... It was a regular jail, but that was the original idea.

The renovation of the old jail, a landmark in the rural Fort Motte community, is included in the county's plans for the coming centennial celebration.

"It's still there and we want to save the jail as part of the 2008 celebration," Roland said. "Several people wanted to buy it, so we used 'Save the Jail' (as a slogan). It's a public building; let's save it. It's falling down, and it would be good for the community."

According to Roland, officials from the State Department of Archives and History said it's very difficult to still find a structure like the old jail anywhere around.

"We're trying to raise \$18,000 to save the jail," she said. "We've received about \$8,000. We're selling T-shirts and seeking contributions."

Also, Roland says, a lot of volunteers are willing to help with the actual work.

For safety reasons, she says, the brickwork must be done professionally, but a "group of volunteers will put the roof on for us."

"We don't want to restore it to pristine condition. We just want to keep it from falling down," she said. "It's been in deplorable condition for years and years. We want to embrace what was here when we became a county."

Once the structure is stabilized, Roland says, plans are to do an "architectural illusion" for the windows. Similar artwork has been done in both St. Matthews and Cameron.

Then, she explains, the old jail will become a tourist attraction for the spruced-up Fort Motte community and a focal point of the annual Reunion Festival.

On Saturday morning, May 10, 2008 a countywide mother's tribute is planned and will be held on the courthouse grounds. All citizens are invited, A roll call in honor or in memory of mothers will be held along with special prayers. On Sunday May 11, 2008, all churches are being asked to take a picture of the oldest mother in their congregation. Along with the picture, the museum would like the church to include a brief history of this person which can include their family members, and stories. Churches may also send a brief history of their church. All of this information will be placed in a special file in the museum's fireproof vault.

Throughout the year, many of the pictures of mothers and their stories will be published in the paper. If anyone else would like to share a photograph and a story of their mother and why she was or is special, the museum would be happy to receive this information. Just think what you share in the year 2008 will be ready for the 2033 celebration when the next generation plans the 125 years of Calhoun County's history.

Calhoun County Museum Hosts Summer Workshops for the L. Marion Gressette Center

The Calhoun County Museum and Cultural Center and the L. Marion Gressette Center have established a partnership to improve the cultural and art outreach of its clients. In order to reach these goals funds were received from the Very Special Arts and the S.C. Arts Commission. Both organizations are working on long and short term goals

to improve the quality of life for its clients. Another part of this grant will be to find ways to provide services for those who have hearing loss. Autism, and Alzheimers.

Resulting from this partnership during the month of June from the 4th to the 20th, The Calhoun County Museum & Cultural Center hosted a Dance Workshop for the L. Marion Gressette Center. Four groups of clients, with approximately fifteen in each group, came for a one hour workshop each day. The clients, under the instructions of Mrs. Jean Reid, learned how to shag and square dance.

In July, a pottery workshop was held at The Calhoun County Museum & Cultural Center. Mr. Keith Tolen, from the Columbia area, taught the clients how to make bowls, ornaments and garden walkway stones. Also from July 23 to August 3, Mr. Tolen held a watercolor and creative art workshop at the L. Marion Gressette Center on Doodle Hill Road.

All of the L. Marion Gressette Center workshops were sponsored in part by a grant from the South Carolina Very Special Arts, the South Carolina Arts Commission which receives funding from the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), and special donations from the Bette Jane Fairey and Darrell Cooper Memorial Funds.
