The Calhoun County Museum and Cultural Center received the Award of Excellence from the SC Federation of Museums for its program of work in 2015. This highly prized award was presented at the Federation's annual meeting in Aiken, SC in March.

The last weekend in March brought two more awards to the Museum and its staff. An "Award of Merit" was given by the Confederation of SC Local Historical Societies for our Calhoun County Faces and Places series, and our Director, Debbie Roland received the "Alexander S. Salley Professional Service Award" for distinguished lifetime service and contributed significantly to history and historical preservation and has professionally advanced the cause of state and local history.



The Cotton Take

Cotton Farming is big in Calhoun County. Dr. Houck Medford's "The Cotton Tale" will be



presented on Thursday.
September 15, 2016. This wonderful documentary film and photography exhibit tells the story of Cameron's Bates Houck's Family farm.
The Houck family has farmed the same land for more than one hundred

years. The film documents farm succession, family faith, and technological advances in the mega

agribusiness of cotton farming. Medford describes this film as "a warm, visual and personal depiction of farming landscape of South Carolina". In conjunction with this documentary South Carolina Farm Bureau Ag in the Classroom Cotton

MUSEUM AWARDS FIRST C. FREDERIC ULMER SCHOLARSHIP

Museum Director Debbie Roland had a dream ~ to honor the memory of Cameron native, C. Frederic Ulmer. Ulmer's career began by giving piano lessons in his hometown. After graduating from Furman and earning his masters in music from Columbia University, Ulmer began teaching at Orangeburg High School as the much loved instructor of music and the mixed chorus director. An auto accident ultimately claimed Ulmer's life in 1980.

In 1997, the Calhoun County Museum paid tribute with "A Salute to the late C. Frederic Ulmer" featuring more than 75 of his former students. Overwhelming support and appreciation for everything Ulmer accomplished led to the creation of a scholarship in his memory.

Rachel Fogle of Cameron was awarded the first C.

Frederic Ulmer Scholarship. She is a senior attending the South Carolina Governor's School for the Arts & Humanities and plans to pursue a degree in piano performance. Rachel began lessons with the late Ms. Julia Helen Garris and is currently a student of Dr. Stephen Taylor. In 2015 she gave three recitals, one at the



Calhoun County Museum and two in Greenville.

The \$500 scholarship was used to help offset the cost of attending Brevard Music Institute, a six week piano intensive program for high school and college music students.


